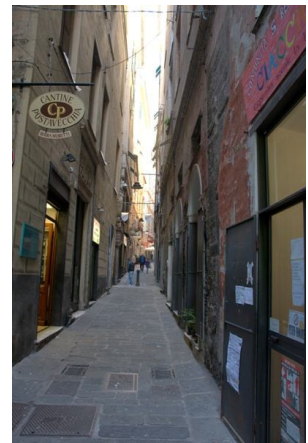
### **AROUND GENOVA**

Itinerary 1: discovering the medieval old town, the oldest historical centre in Europe



The itinerary will bring you from Porta Soprana, the beautiful medieval entrance door, just a few steps away from Cristoforo Colombo's house, through the mysterious and narrow streets of the old town, till the open spaces from Palazzo Ducale, the ancient government's seat of the Republic of Genoa, Piazza De Ferrari and via XX Settembre.

Itinerary 2: find the treasures of Genoa's Porto Antico ("Old Harbour") and the old city's "vicoli" (narrow streets) behind



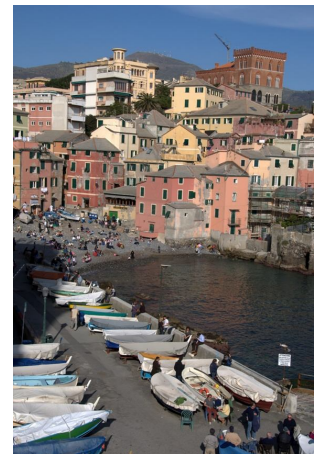
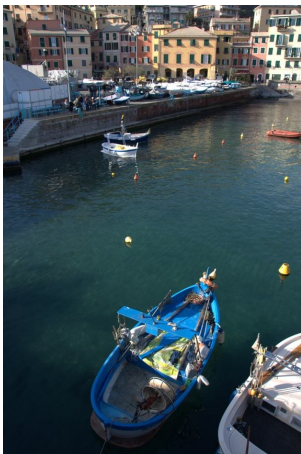
The itinerary focuses on the Porto Antico's area, renovated in the nineties, and on the old city's vicoli behind. It also provides for all the drawing and collage lovers a visit to the Luzzati's Museum or a tour in Genoa's Aquarium, famous in all Europe.

Itinerary 3: have a look to the ancient genteel palaces of via Garibaldi and Genoa's elevators



Curious to know how Genoa's inhabitants move "plumb-line"? You will discover one of the 9 Genoa's elevators and the beautiful Spianata Castelletto with its enchanting view on the city's roofs and the sea. The itinerary provides also a visit to the ancient genteel palaces and museums of via Garibaldi and to some of the most animated old city's vicoli.

Itinerary 4: walking along Genoa's coast



Through Corso Italia, the elegant Genoese seafront promenade, you will reach Boccadasse, ancient and colourful fishing village, one of the jewels of Genoa. At the eastern end of the city you can go on walking along the picturesque seafront promenade of Nervi and through its parks and have a rest at the little harbour.
